

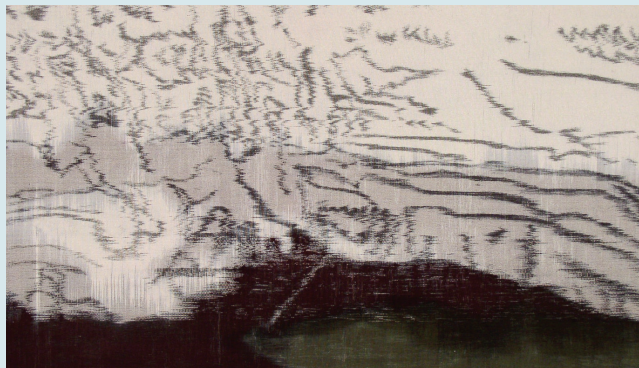

PULSE: Hildur Ásgeirsdóttir Jónsson: Energy Forms

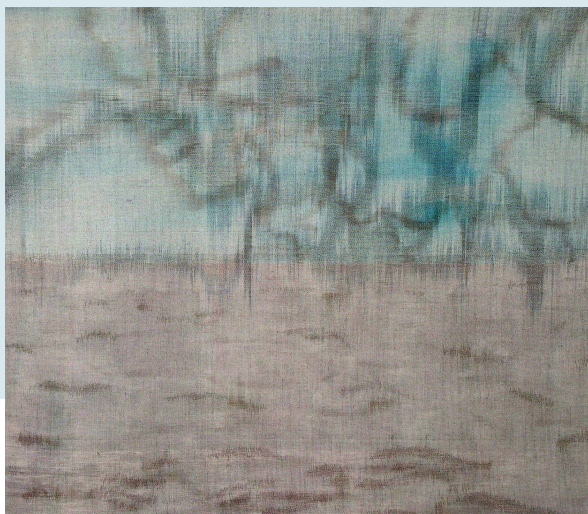
Hildur Ásgeirsdóttir Jónsson

creates silk weavings, intricate embroideries and ink drawings that communicate the inherent energy of the natural world. Originally from Iceland, Jónsson calls attention to the physicality of the earth and our relationship with it by referencing Icelandic glacial formations, expanses of sea and sky as well as the constant activity of the cosmos.
